

Suggested Questions for Discussion on Immigration and Border Security

1. Should the U.S. use troops and technology to close our borders to stop illegal entry and to make it clear that smuggling isn't worth the risk?
2. Should states grant driver's licenses to illegal aliens?
3. Should U.S. authorities (police, motor vehicle departments, government benefit offices, etc.) accept I.D. cards issued by foreign countries as though they were valid I.D.s?
4. Should our immigration officials establish safeguards to prevent the entry of foreign diseases?
5. Should U.S. taxpayers provide illegal aliens with benefits such as public school education, free hospital care, or in-state college tuition?
6. Since it is common knowledge that student visas are a great source of fraud, and several of the 9/11 hijackers were in the U.S. on student visas, should the government establish strict controls and tracking on student visas?
7. Since legal immigration is now running at about five times what it was traditionally, should we have a time-out on legal immigration until the government gets a good system of tracking the whereabouts of foreigners who enter the U.S.?
8. Should local law enforcement cooperate with federal officials to apprehend illegal aliens?
9. What should be done about U.S. employers who hire illegal aliens or who abuse H-1B and L-1 visas to import lower-paid foreigners and lay off U.S. employees?
10. Should we eliminate foreign language ballots?
