

Suggested Questions for Discussion on Judicial Attacks on Our Culture

1. What should be done if the Supreme Court or any court bans the words “under God” from the Pledge of Allegiance or the placement of the Ten Commandments in public buildings?
2. Should we have the right to acknowledge God in public places, and if so, how can we do this despite activist judges?
3. Contrast the common expression “the Constitution is what the Supreme Court says it is” with Congress’s Article III power over the judiciary.
4. What issues should be taken away from the Courts?
5. Should federal judges have term limits or be subject to voter recall?
6. Should the President refuse to enforce activist rulings?
7. Should Congress cut off the money to enforce activist court decisions?
8. What should we do when activist judges rule in favor of same-sex marriage?
9. What can we do when activist judges use foreign sources to make decisions about U.S. law?
10. What were the three most important court decisions of the past five years?
11. Is it practical to try to impeach activist judges?
